



Since its inception, the committee pledged to undertake the challenge of making a difference in the lives of the less fortunate & deserving students of, but not limited to, our 'Alma Mater'.

The deserving cases identified for assistance were as under-

- A student from Class VI (had lost his father).
- A student from Class XI (had lost both her parents). 2:
- A student from Class XII (had lost her father in spite of the mother donating her kidney to the husband). 3:
- A student from Class VIII & her sibling Class IV (had lost their father & the mother is an illiterate young lady).

Case no. 1 :- Education fee is being funded by the OSAPS Welfare Association since its inception.

Case no. 2 & 4 :- Since the demise of the parent/parents resulted due to accident, therefore, cases for their claim against 'Suraksha Kavach' policy were put up to National Insurance Company through AWES HQ. Finally after a lot of struggle, monetary benefit for

continuing their education was granted, which is being extended to the concerned children.

For case no. 2:- Tuition fee was being funded by the OSAPS Welfare Association till the realization of the claim from the Insurance

Case no. 3 :- Since this case was not an accident case, therefore, a ease for special monetary grant from AWWA, was put up (duly recommended by the Chairman of the school) for higher studies of the brilliant candidate.

THE MONTH OF MAY 2013 brought cheer to the OSAPS Welfare Association. With the constant motivation, monitoring & mentoring of the student in case no. 3 by Team OSAPS, the student made our school proud by scoring 93% in CBSE Class XII exam. This was not all, she also came out with flying colours in Engineering & Medical Entrance Exams. She chose medical stream over engineering and is currently pursuing her MBBS course from Allahabad Medical College.

IN THE MONTH OF MAY 2013, Team OSAPS took another giant step and broadened their horizon when they met the Chairperson of CWC (N.F. & East) Bench of Magistrates, Govt. of NCT Delhi in his office (Sanskar Ashram, Dilshad Garden) and offered to help in the noble cause of rehabilitation of victims of child abuse or other crimes including rape, trafficking, child labour or sexual assault. Army Public School's St alumni body offers to Br sponsor rape victims

NEW DELH: Efforts to engage society in the rehabilitation of victims of sexual assault by the Child Welfare Committee (CWC) have finally paid off,

Nearly a month after the committee announced a scheme in which individuals or organisations can help rehabilitate victims of such crimes, the welfare committee of the Alumni Association, Army Public School, Dhaula Kuan, have offered their services.

Members of the committee met Delhi government's Child Welfare Committee (east) and equressed their desire to sponsor such victims either by paying for their education, accommodation or health expenses.

"Few of the members of our association met CWC (east) authorities. The final decision in this regard will be taken in July at a meeting of all the members," said an association member, who was present in the meeting but wished to remain anonymous.

So far people used to sponsor orphans or under-privileged students but rarely did

one sponsor a rape victim.
"The Army Public School's

Alumni Association has shown a keen interest in sponsoring rape victims. It is good that people are coming forward to help victims of sexual assault. While sponsorship programmes are common for orphans, it is probably the first time that an initiative Eie this is being taken," said Ajay K Singh, chairman, CWC (onst.).

"Even traders' associations have come forward to help. Some individuals have effered books, pencils and pens. Every hit of help counts," Singh added.

The CWC will prepare a database of sponsors. They can help with the education, medical treatment or the entire rehabilitation of the victim.

Individuals or organisations who want to offer help will have to get themselves enrolled with the CWC, which will contact them wherever a secusi assault case is reported.


